Valdez, AK – Valdez COVID-19 Unified Command provides the following local weekly summary covering developments over the last seven days.

Valdez Case Count Updates & Trends

Since the time of our last weekly summary on Feb. 5, the community of Valdez received notification of one new resident case and zero new non-resident cases of COVID-19. As of midnight on Feb. 11, Valdez has zero active resident cases and zero active non-resident cases.

The new resident case was reported to DHSS after the conclusion of the patient's isolation period. So while the case counts towards the cumulative Valdez resident case count, they are automatically recorded as recovered.

Please continue to work together to protect our community and our healthcare system. Continue to keep your social circle small and consistent. Try to limit your time traveling outside Valdez to only that which is necessary. Continue to wear a mask which covers your mouth and nose when you are around anyone outside of your household, even if you are outdoors or can maintain six feet of physical distance. **Remember to stay home if you are sick** and arrange for COVID-19 testing, even if you have only one mild symptom. Testing promptly and working cooperatively with public health contact tracers helps ensure others at risk are quickly identified to prevent further spread.

COVID-19 Vaccine Update

COVID-19 vaccines authorized for emergency use by the FDA are highly effective for the protection of the patient and prevention of severe illness. **However, it remains unknown whether vaccinated individuals can carry the virus and transmit it to others. Those vaccinated must continue to take precautions to protect those around them**, including physical distancing, wearing a mask, and practicing good hygiene.

COVID-19 vaccine is allocated in Valdez based upon state and federal guidelines. Local officials do not make allocation decisions. Valdez Unified Command's Vaccine Task Force, comprised of members of the local medical community, public health, city staff, Valdez Native Tribe representatives, and others, work together to determine logistics for vaccine distribution based upon state/federal allocation guidelines.

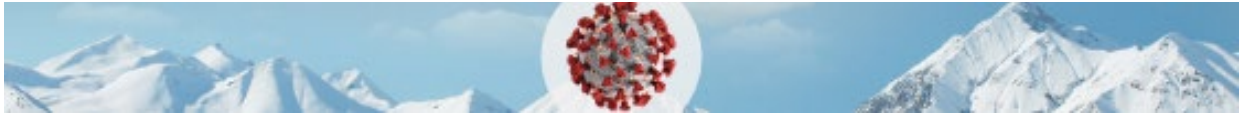
The following people are currently eligible for vaccine under state guidelines:

- **OPEN: Phase 1A – All Tiers:** Healthcare/medical workers and long term care residents.
- **OPEN: Phase 1B – Tier 1:** Individuals age 65 and older.
- **NEW! OPEN Phase 1B – Tier 2:**
 - People age 50 years & older who have a high risk medical condition.
 - People age 50 years & older who are frontline essential workers and required to work within six feet of others.
 - People living or working in congregate settings not covered in Phase 1A.
 - Education staff, limited to PreK-12 educators & support staff, childcare workers & support staff, and indigenous language & cultural bearers.
 - Limited pandemic response staff who may come into contact with the SARS-CoV-2 virus during outbreak response activities.

Valdez will not receive any additional first dose state vaccine allocation for the remainder of February. The focus for late February POD clinics will be distribution of second dose vaccine.

Local vaccine supply and appointments in March will be very limited in number at first, based upon state vaccine allocation amounts for our community. Additional appointments will become available once final March allocation numbers are confirmed with the state.

Residents of Valdez and surrounding communities who qualify under Phase 1B – Tier 2 were eligible to begin making appointments this week for the first POD clinic scheduled in early March. Those previously eligible – people 65 years and older and most healthcare workers – are also still able to schedule first dose appointments if they have not already done so.



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Two Valdez options exist to make appointments for those currently eligible:

- **Preferred Appointment Option:** Make a vaccination appointment online: <http://covidvax.alaska.gov>. Please note, the Valdez online scheduling button will only be shown when appointment slots are available. Those eligible should check back often if you are not able to make an appointment right away. Additional appointments will be added as Valdez is allocated more vaccine supply from the state in the near future.
- **Alternate Appointment Option:** If you do not have internet access or need help with scheduling online, you can also make a vaccination appointment by calling the DHSS Valdez Public Health Center at 907.835.4612.

As of Feb. 12, the following cumulative number of COVID-19 vaccinations have been administered in Valdez (these numbers include state and IHS allocations):

- **Pfizer-BioNTech:** 186 first doses and 154 second doses.
- **Moderna:** 568 first doses and 211 second doses.

Valdez Testing Options

If you think you may have been exposed to the virus which causes COVID-19, please reach out to the Valdez Public Health Clinic or your medical provider for guidance on next steps. Multiple options exist for both symptomatic and asymptomatic testing in Valdez. All local testing options are by appointment only and at no out-of-pocket cost to the patient. Valdez Economic Relief & Recovery

In addition to mitigating the health impacts of COVID-19 in Valdez, our community has been working diligently to address the economic impacts from the pandemic felt by residents, businesses, and non-profit organizations. The City of Valdez continues to accept applications for the following economic recovery programs:

- **Valdez Advertising & Marketing Grant Program:** Provides a matching grant up to \$5,000 to assist local tourism-related small businesses market their company and our community to visitors. Grant applications closed today. **As of Feb. 11, a total of 21 grants have been awarded, with ten additional applications in review.**
- **Valdez COVID-19 Business Economic Recovery Grant Program:** Provides financial recovery assistance to Valdez businesses negatively impacted by COVID-19, up to \$10,000 per business. Grant applications closed today. **As of Feb. 11, a total of 28 businesses have applied for the program.**
- **COVID Conscious Business Program:** The COVID Conscious Business Program recognizes local businesses and organizations for following recommended COVID-19 safety practices to protect their workforce, their customers/clients/guests, and our community. Program applicants must earn a minimum of 85 points from a list of COVID-19 education, planning, and prevention efforts to earn the certification. **As of Feb. 11, a total of 54 local businesses have received program certification.**
